The Worship Committee met back on February 6 and began our first meeting of the year, as always, by reviewing how the Advent/Christmas services went. We like to take time to reflect on each season of worship in the church so that we can take notes on what went well and what could be
 improved for the next time that season comes around again. The upcoming Lenten season and Holy Week were discussed and service times were decided on. Look for those dates and times in the announcements and daily devotions as the days draw closer. Our newly created Winter Weather Service Cancellation Policy was put into place back on January 14 with temps well below -20 degrees. We did make one additional stipulation on the policy that indicates that if the sanctuary is below 55 degrees services will be cancelled as well. This would be due to boiler issues that are beyond our control sometimes! Another topic of discussion was our communion bread. We debated and discussed the pros and cons of different styles of presentation and ultimately, we voted and decided that we will use whole loaf bread. Our communion servers will clean their hands with hand sanitizer and then be responsible for breaking off and presenting each person with their piece. Coming up the Sunday after Easter will be our "Great Day of Music" service so mark your calendars for a fun service of singing, bells, instruments and some music history!

## Finance Committee:

In January, our general fund receipts were $\$ 16,713.71$ only off a little bit from last year which were $\$ 17,078.12$. General fund budgeted type expenses for the same period were $\$ 29,587.11$. Part of the expenses were $\$ 1,738.75$ for a Radon mitigation system for the parsonage and an increase in our property insurance that is paid quarterly and the January quarterly payment was $\$ 4,495.50$. Utilities were cheaper in January of this year by $\$ 1,518.17$. The lack of snow will really help our budgeted expenses be less this first part of the year.
As always, feel free to ask any Finance Committee member any questions on finances or ask the church office and they can relay those questions to the finance committee for a follow up if needed.
